National Emergency Military Absence

Policy For the 2024 Permanent Fund Dividend

Issued by the Office of the Commissioner

The provisions of this policy apply to an otherwise eligible individual who during 2023 was serving on active duty as a member of the armed forces of the United States and could not return to Alaska for at least 72 consecutive hours during 2022 or 2023. This policy applies only to the 2024 dividend year (based on the 2023 qualifying year and the requirement that applicants must have returned to Alaska for at least 72 consecutive hours during 2022 or 2023).

This waiver will also apply to the eligible military members' spouse, minor dependents and disabled dependents.

Alaska Statute 43.23.005(f)(1) states:

"In time of national military emergency, the commissioner may waive the requirement of (a)(4) of this section for an individual absent from the state under military orders while serving in the armed forces of the United States, or for the spouse and dependents of that individual."

As per statute, and given that the United States is in a time of national military emergency, the Department of Revenue hereby waives the 72-hour return requirement for the eligible military member, his or her spouse, minor dependents and disabled dependents under AS 43.23.005(a)(4) if the military member applicant:

- Requests a waiver of the requirement for being physically present In Alaska for at least 72 consecutive hours at some time during 2022 or 2023 for themself and their named spouse, minor dependents and disabled dependents; and
- Provides a 2023 Leave and Earning Statement showing receipt of Imminent danger or hostile firepay.

Nothing in this policy is intended to waive the 30-day cumulative return requirement of AS 43.23.008(d)(1).

The waiver from the 72-hour return requirement will expire with the 2025 dividend.
